

Articulation Agreement between Middlesex Community College and the University of Hartford Criminal Justice Program

The purpose of this agreement is to affect the smooth transfer of graduates of Middlesex Community College (MxCC) to the University of Hartford Criminal Justice Program. It applies to those courses required for the Associates of Science in Criminal Justice Degree. It provides specific information whereby students can transfer as juniors into the Criminal Justice Program

Stipulations of Agreement:

1. Students receiving an Associate's Degree with a 2.0 or higher cumulative grade point average will be guaranteed admission to the Criminal Justice Program provided they complete the required admission process, and subject to space and availability in the program.
2. Only grades of "C" or higher will transfer.
3. MxCC transfer students will be subject to all general education and other requirements for the Criminal Justice Degree. All requirements are in the current University of Hartford bulletin.
4. The Criminal Justice Program encourages MxCC students to complete their Associate's degree at MxCC. This helps ensure readiness of MxCC students to be successful after transfer. This agreement applies only to those students who have completed their degree program.
5. This agreement will require revision on June 30th, 2018, at which point it will be reviewed by both parties. Any curriculum changes could necessitate review at an earlier date and potentially negate the remainder of the agreement.
6. The contact person at the University of Hartford will be the Director of the Criminal Justice Program and at MxCC the Coordinator of the Criminal Justice Program.
