Articulation Agreement between Middlesex Community College (MXCC) and the University of Hartford Psychology Department.

Through our strong partnership in education, The University of Hartford continues to welcome transfer applicants from Middlesex Community College for all majors.

The purpose of this agreement is to effect the smooth transfer of graduates of Middlesex

Community College (MXCC) to the University of Hartford on behalf of its Psychology Dept.

This agreement applies to MXCC students completing coursework towards the completion of the Associate of Arts in Psychology Studies.

This agreement provides specific information whereby students can have a seamless transfer as juniors into the University of Hartford's B.A. in Psychology within the College of Arts and Sciences.

Stipulations of the Agreement:

- 1. Students receiving an associate's degree with a 2.0 or higher cumulative grade point average will be guaranteed admission to the Psychology Department's course of study towards a B.A. provided they complete the required admission application process.
- 2. Only grades of "C" or higher will transfer.
- MXCC transfer students will be subject to all general education and other requirements for the B.A Psychology Degree. All requirements can be found in the current University of Hartford Bulletin at Hartford edu.
- 4. For purposes of this agreement, The College of Arts and Sciences requires MXCC students to complete their associate's degree at MXCC prior to transfer. This helps ensure the readiness of MXCC students to undertake study for the 4-year degree. This agreement therefore applies only to those students who have completed an Associate of Arts at MXCC.
- 5. This agreement will be in effect for students seeking transfer to the University of Hartford beginning term Fall 2017 and thereafter.
- 6. This agreement will require re-approval on June 30, 2019, at which point both parties will review it. Any curriculum changes at either participating institution could necessitate review at an earlier date and potentially negate the remainder of the agreement.
- 7. The primary contact person at the University of Hartford will be the Director of Recruitment for the College of Arts and Sciences with the Chair of the Psychology Department acting as a secondary contact, and at MXCC the Psychology Discipline Coordinator.
